Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am continually surprised by how fast the weeks fly by and I find it is time once again to work on the next month's newsletter.

So far we have already Sprung Ahead (Day Light Savings Time change), School Spring Break has come and gone along with St. Patrick's Day, and we have moved into the Season of Spring with the Spring Equinox on March 20th. We have also had four Wednesday Lenten Soup and Bread Meals along with three Sundays in Lent.

As we move into the month of April we have two more Wednesday Lenten Soup and Bread Meals before we enter Holy Week with Services on Maundy Thursday, April 21<sup>st</sup>; Good Friday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>; and then Easter Sunday, April 24<sup>th</sup>.

This Lenten Season we have been asking each member of Peace Lutheran to consider: "Whom do I listen to? Do I listen more to the world that surrounds me than to God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit?"

We have also asked members to faithfully read their Bibles, to attend Worship Services on Sundays and Wednesdays as part of this year's Lenten Discipline and growth in their faith life.

Hopefully we have all been somewhat successful in accomplishing some of those Lenten Disciplines.

In the Ancient Church, Lent was the time to prepare for Baptism with Baptisms taking place on Easter Morning. We do not hold to that baptismal tradition so much these days, with Baptisms taking place all year long.

But as a people who walk wet in our baptismal waters and in our baptismal covenant with God, as a people who daily remember our baptismal dying and rising with Christ Jesus, we are reminded that it is God whom we are called to truly listen to and to not listen to the message of the world that surrounds us; "**Satisfy** your personal desires, they are of much more importance and relevance than God's WORD!"

In Luther's Small Catechism, Luther's explanation of The Sacrament of Holy Baptism reminds us: **What does Baptism mean for daily living?**

*It means our sinful self, with all its evil deeds and desires, should be drowned through daily repentance; and that day after day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever.*

St. Paul writes in Romans 6:

*"We were buried therefore with him by Baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we to might walk in newness of life."*

As we remember our baptismal covenant with God:

- To live among God's faithful people,
- To hear God's WORD,
- To partake of Holy Communion,
- To know the Lord's Prayer, the Creeds, and the Ten Commandments,
- To read the Bible,
- To be nurtured in faith and prayer,
- To learn to trust in God,
- To proclaim Christ Jesus through our words and our deeds,
- To care for others and the world,
- To work for justice and peace in the world, we become more and more aware of the fact that we truly can not fulfill all of these promises that we have made to God without God's help.

So during the remaining weeks of Lent, as we fast approach Easter Sunday Morning, may God help us in our Lenten disciplines and may God help us to truly **LISTEN TO HIM** instead of the world.

From the book published by Augsburg Publishing House in 1984, Passover Seder, Ritual and Menu for an Observance by Christians, I have taken the following information.

...The Seder is one part of the present-day Jewish Seven day Passover Celebration. The name Passover harks back to the time when God, through Moses, led the Israelites out of their

slavery in Egypt....

Christians are particularly interested in this ritual meal because it was during a Passover celebration that Jesus instituted Holy Communion. It should be realized, however, that the Passover clearly predates and is entirely separate from the Eucharist. The Seder is a later Jewish form of the Passover observation, useful, and important in its own right, having been practiced for more than 1,000 years.....

The meal we share is a potluck meal in which we try to avoid those items that are forbidden in the Jewish meal. Thus we do not bring any raised bread products, mitzvah is allowed. No ham or pork is served or used in the preparation of the meal. Milk and dairy products should also be avoided in preparing meat dishes. Milk should be avoided entirely.

Some suggested menu items in the book are: Soups: chicken with mitzvah balls or kosher egg noodles, vegetable, borscht. Entrees: Kosher meats such as chicken, beef, lamb, or turkey.

## Peace Lutheran Council Minutes – March 10, 2011

### COUNCIL MEETING

Bruce Sorensen presented opening devotions from the book Radical by David Platt.

Lady Bug Preschool representatives asked to continue to use Peace Lutheran Church for the 2011-2012 school year. They mentioned that they are finding things amiss in some of their rooms on Thursday mornings. Debra Briggs will be the liaison between Lady Bug Preschool and Peace Lutheran. Lady Bug currently pays \$600.00 per month for rent and that will be discussed at a later Council meeting. They asked to possibly have an additional section for the upcoming school year. They currently have 68 children enrolled and they charge \$85.00 per month per child, with an additional \$35.00 registration fee. Lisa Duffey moved to continue the facility use by Lady Bug Preschool and Debra Briggs seconded, motion carried.

**Treasurer's report:** There are "line items" in the Special Donations Account that should be moved to their appropriate accounts (Altar Guild, Manic Monday lunches and Youth Group). Also the PLC library has \$102.29 to spend. John Gillis moved to disperse the funds into the appropriate accounts, Gretchen Carrels seconded, motion carried.

**Congregational concerns:** Communion music continues to be addressed. The Church Council recommends that the Worship Team only have instrumental music during Communion to be able to create a meditative environment. A congregational member would like Sunday School to be moved to 10:30am.

**Staff concerns:** none

**Pastor's report:** He is having fun having Bob Coughlin participate in services. Pastor encourages people to pray for the people on the prayer concerns. We are to be a "ministry of presence". Pastor continues to travel to Townsend on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of each month.

#### Team reports:

**Education:** Peacemakers will put eggs together for the annual Easter egg hunt on Easter Sunday. The high schooler's will hide the eggs. A Vacation Bible School coordinator is needed for VBS the week of June 13, time to be determined.

**Youth & Family:** The Youth Encounter was good. The high schooler's would like to do a presentation on Easter Sunday. John Gillis moved to let them and Val Ross seconded, motion carried. Youth & Family is coordinating a summer event on the Hiawatha Trail and a day at Silverwood.

**Stewardship:** This is a very thankful time at PLC!

**Worship & Music:** The passing of the peace will return to being done in the service instead of at the end. All April services have been planned, including Wednesday evenings. Easter services will be at 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. (please note times).

**Property Care:** New doors have been installed at PLC. The next projects proposed will be the roof of PLC, the windows, popcorn ceiling and the dip in the bathroom floor (all in the parsonage). The Men's Breakfast group will prioritize the projects.

**Outreach:** The April focus will be the Community Gardens. PLC donated 357 pounds of food in March to the Gallatin Valley Food Bank. Thank you to all!

**Congregational Life:** Will be addressing the prayer request form.

#### Old business:

A gate will be installed in the fencing around the Memorial Garden area. There is plenty of dirt at the Sorensen's that will be moved to the Memorial Gardens.

#### New business:

Election of officers - Gretchen Carrels moved to have the existing officers remain in position, Bob Coughlin seconded, motion carried.
